




The park contains a "Freedom Wall" with the names of fallen soldiers from New Mexico or ties to our state as a reminder that our freedom is not free; an 8-foot marble replica of the twin towers; a steel beam from the World Trade Center; an 8-foot wingspan steel sculpture of an Eagle; a first responders shovel used at the Pentagon; and a 10,000 pound piece of limestone recovered from the rubble of the Pentagon with a plaque dedicated to the many lives that were tragically taken from us on 9/11/01.




**SEPTEMBER 11, 2001
